

## Birds and the Taj

Keoladeo Ghana National Park



### Day 01 Delhi/Bharatpur ( Birding )

Arrive Delhi and drive to Bharatpur transfer to The Bagh

The Keoladeo “Ghana” National Park was declared a reserve for birds in 1956 and later upgraded to National Park. UNESCO has listed it as a world heritage site.

Commonly referred to as Bharatpur, the Park is a delight for bird watchers. Over 375 species of birds are found here. The raised paths, camouflaged by babool trees and undergrowth make viewing easy. A quiet ride by boat in the early hours of the morning is also unforgettable experience. The cacophony is unbelievable as **painted storks, open bills, spoonbills, egrets, cormorants, white ibis** and multitudes of others, tend their young. **Jacanas** with their iridescent colors and elegant tail feathers and purple **moroccan** can be seen delicately treading over the floating vegetation.

#### Fatehpur Sikri

An epic in red sandstone, a city of yesteryears, today lost in the mists of time..... Fatehpur Sikri was built by the Mughal Emperor Akbar during 1564 A.D. In search of male heir, the childless Akbar went to Sikri to seek the blessings of the Muslim saint Sheikh Salim Chishti. When his son was finally born, in gratitude, Akbar constructed a new capital and named it Fatehpur Sikri. Later, due to shortage of water and unrest in north-west, Akbar had to abandon this city.

The beautiful marble tomb of Sheikh Salim Chisti attracts thousands who seek blessings of the revered saint. Other renowned places are Diwan-e-Am, Diwan-e-Khaas, Buland Darwaza, Panch Mahal, Jodha Bai's Palace and Birbal Bhavan.

#### Taj Mahal

Agra is famous as being home to one of the seven wonders of the world- the Taj Mahal. The construction of the Taj took 22 years and involved a labour force of 20,000 workers. The architectural splendor of the mausoleums, the fort and the palaces in Agra is a vivid reminder of the capital in the 16th and early 17th centuries.
